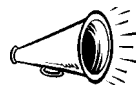

bob wilcox

New Junior Warden Bob Wilcox is a veteran of Winnetka, Christ Church, and the armed services. Raised in Winnetka, he attended the old Horace Mann School and attended Sunday School here soon after the Parish House was built. A member of Harvard's Class of '44, Bob served in the U.S. Navy in the western Pacific during World War II and married his wife, Laura, in 1944. After recovering from a war injury, Bob attended law school at the U. of Michigan and practiced law in Chicago until he retired.

Laura and Bob moved to Winnetka in 1952 and purchased the home on Willow and Walnut where they raised their five children. After Laura died, Bob moved to Evanston, and their oldest son and his family now live in the Wilcox home.
