What If Carol Hadn't Gone To That Party?

To trace the origin of the musical genes of our amazing Organist and Choirmaster, Richard Clemmitt, you need to poke around in his extended family. His mom played the piano for fun and his Dad had a great appreciation for music. Professional musicians don't materialize until you search a bit further afield. Richard acknowledges one composer and two piano teachers in his larger clan which could be the genesis of his innate talent. Over his life Richard has taken what God gave him and augmented it with many years of study and passion to share his musical ministry with us at Christ Church. How lucky for us.

Richard was born in Washington DC and grew up with his two younger sisters in neighboring Bethesda, Maryland. Residing in one home his entire childhood, he describes a wonderful time filled with regular kid things like school, good friends, soccer, ice hockey and lots and lots of music. His family attended St. John's Episcopal Church in Washington DC (a.k.a. "The Presidents Church" across from the White House.) Sensing Richard's fascination with the organ at an early age, his dad would sneak him behind the organist to watch him play the postlude. These moments became formative for Richard's future path in the world of music.

Richard started piano lessons at age five and pretty much never looked back. Although it is good to know (for us mortals) that he did have a period of rebellion where he quit "simply because my parents were making me take the lessons." That period didn't last long. He attended the Washington National Cathedral Episcopal schools from kindergarten through twelfth grade, and from fourth grade on he attended chapel every day and sang good old Episcopal hymns on a daily basis. Again watching the organist play with his feet was like magic to the eyes of this nine year old child. During his stint at the Cathedral schools he sang in every chorus, choir or musical play that would have him. Among other credits he was a gondolier in "The Gondoliers" by Gilbert and Sullivan and he played the lead in "Boys from Syracuse."

After graduating from high school he attended the University of Pennsylvania for one year before he transferred to the more music performance oriented New England Conservatory in downtown Boston where he thrived. In 1986 he graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree in Organ Performance. He stayed in the Boston area for three years, supporting himself playing the organ, teaching, accompanying, and conducting at local churches and music schools.

In the fall of 1989 he packed up his car and headed towards Princeton, New Jersey where he would begin his graduate work at the Westminster Choir College and meet his future wife within the first five minutes of being on campus. Literally. "In typical fashion I drove into Princeton with one minute to spare before the start of the New Student Orientation. During the first five minutes of the meeting I saw this beautiful girl walking towards me. We began dating right away and were married less than a year later in the Village Presbyterian Church in Kansas City where Elizabeth grew up. When you know, you just know." Amen. While Richard was there to study choral conducting and Elizabeth (our amazing Primary Choir Director...how's that for a dynamic duo?) was there to study Music Education, the entire school sang in the Symphonic Choir which was the official choir for the New York Philharmonic. Several times throughout the year this choir would travel to New York City to accompany the Philharmonic, the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Berlin Philharmonic or "whatever major orchestra was in town." They also sang at Leonard Bernstein's memorial concert at Carnegie Hall. How cool is it to experience these moments with the love of your life!

So how did Richard and Elizabeth get from Princeton, NJ to Winnetka, IL? Good question. In 1992 Christ Church was in a bit of a state of flux. The church was simultaneously searching for a new Rector and an interim Organist and Choirmaster. Carol Schroeder, a member of the music search committee, was at a party at the home of Marjorie and Andy Valentine where she met someone who knew Richard from Westminster College and knew that he was looking for a full time church gig. Carol called Richard. Would he be interested in applying for the interim job? Richard agreed as long as he could also be considered for the permanent position when the time arrived. He jumped in the car, drove to Connecticut to meet the soon-to-be new Rector and his wife, Ned and Bev Prevost. It was perfect chemistry from the get go. You could call it fate. I call it the work of the Holy Spirit.

When Richard arrived at Christ Church, one week before Ned and Bev, there were eight adults and six children in the choir. Marnie Prevost was about to raise the number of children to seven. Today there are 25 children in the Primary Choir (thank you, Elizabeth,) 75 children in the Youth Choir (3rd through

12th grade) and 25 adults singing in our choir. In 1994 Richard, with the aid of Head Choristers, Farley Green and Caroline Gray, organized a choir trip to St. Louis with 20 other choristers. He has orchestrated a trip every year since. He spiced it up in 1998 with the first of six England trips when he took a choir of 30 to Lichfield, England. Subsequent England destinations have been Ely, Wells, Durham, Lincoln and Salisbury, where this past summer there were 55 in the choir and 95 people on the trip. (Stay tuned for Canterbury in 2011 and York in 2013.) He also restarted the Handbell Choir in 1993, and it currently has ten members. Talk about influencing a program and infusing a church with your passion for music. Music is Richard's ministry in the world and we are the lucky recipients of his light, energy and good grace.

When Richard isn't "doing" music for us you may find him hiking in Colorado with Elizabeth and his two sons, Ethan (age 13) and Adam (age 10), riding his bike, enjoying a movie, ice skating at Centennial Park or coaching a soccer game for Ethan or Adam (or both!). I suspect that even when Richard is "off duty" music is constantly playing in his head. Some very interesting four legged creatures share the Clemmitts' Wilmette home. They are named Charcoal, Tofu, Marshmallow, Cocoa and Brie. Ask him about them sometime. I guarantee it will make him smile.

ERD Success Story: A Boat of Her Own

Elena is a food vendor in the community of Uros-Chulluni, Peru, where the only mode of transportation is by boat. The expense of renting a boat to sell her food limited both her business growth and mobility. Although Elena dreamed of owning her own boat, she had no collateral to secure one.

Through a micro-finance program supported by Episcopal Relief & Development, the Ecumenical Church Loan Fund and the Anglican Diocese of Peru, Elena and her neighbors formed a community bank. She was then able to obtain a small loan without traditional collateral, enabling her to buy her own boat.

Now Elena's business has expanded to include not only the sale of food, but also hand-crafts and candy. She's thankful to Episcopal Relief & Development for showing her how to improve her income, continue her children's education and strengthen her family.

What is a Vocational Deacon?

At Christ Church we now enjoy the ministries of a Vocational Deacon, The Rev. Heath Missner, who was Ordained to the Diaconate on February 6. Having served as a Lector, an Acolyte and a Lay Parish Chaplain, Heath, at the suggestion of the clergy, discerned a 'call', which was affirmed by a discernment committee, to the servant ministry of a Vocational Deacon. Heath will not go on to become a priest. As a Vocational Deacon, Heath will serve liturgically, by reading the Gospel, setting the table, and dismissing the congregation. A Vocational Deacon serves directly under the Bishop, works out in the world, is non-stipendiary, is tasked to bring the church to the world and the world to the church, and to serve all persons, especially the marginalized. Heath next will preach on Maundy Thursday, and join in the foot washing, emblematic of the ministry of servanthood. Heath is a Spiritual Director, trained at The Institute for Spiritual Leadership in Hyde Park, and she serves on the boards of St. Leonard's Ministries (an Episcopal agency which works with formerly incarcerated men and women), the Samaritan Counseling Center, and the Winnetka Interfaith Council. Heath has raised four children and a granddaughter, lives in Wilmette, is a yoga enthusiast and loves walking her Tibetan Spaniels.

Vestry Notes - January, 19, 2010



The Rector commented on the extraordinarily successful "Buy a Brick" program. Due to the generosity of our parishioners, we have raised over \$40,000 which will be used to build a school within our companion diocese in Renk, Sudan. He also commented on our vibrant and alive Christmas Services which were enhanced by the visual image of our Buy a Brick tree. The Rector commented that the 2010 stewardship program, the 2010 budget and personnel reviews for 2009 have had much of his focus recently. He also reported on Jim Harrison's recent ordination to the transitional diaconate on December 20th which will be followed by Jim's ordination as a priest on June 19th. The Rector announced that Christ Church will be applying for a grant from the Lilly Foundation which has generously provided financial support for the development of Curates throughout the Chicago Diocese. He noted that we hope to receive a \$15,000 grant in 2010 to help fund Jim Harrison in his role, after his formal ordination, as the Curate of Christ Church. The Rector also previewed the upcoming Lenten giving program to benefit the Episcopal Relief and Development Fund. The basic thrust of the program, which is being led by Lisa Kerpan and Missy Harrison, is to leverage the time and talent of our parishioners combined with some seed money from Christ Church to hopefully generate a meaningful Lenten offering which will then be used as micro loans by people in need in developing countries.

Associate Rector Jeanne Stewart reported that she has been particularly focused on the upcoming Annual Meeting and the various reports that are part of the 2009 Annual Report that will be made available to parishioners. Jeanne noted that since the last Vestry meeting, she has also been involved in planning the upcoming Lenten program and has been actively involved in the development of the 2010 budget for Christ Church. She noted that she is part of a "mustard seed" group within the Chicago Diocese which helps to lead parishes that are in the process of being formed.

Steve Hudson (Stewardship) reported that as of January 7, 2010, 296 pledges have been received totaling \$1,012,326. This represents a net increase of \$128,213 over 2009 pledge levels. This total includes 39 new pledges for a total of \$77,209, 109 parishioners who increased their pledges, as compared to last year, which so far total \$410,960, 117 pledges that were unchanged as compared to last year totaling \$425,784, and 31 parishioners whose pledges were decreased as compared to the prior year and totaled \$98,373. Additional pledges of approximately \$25,000 are expected based on prior pledge history which would take our total pledge number to \$1,040,000 for the upcoming year.

Kathy Shanley (Treasurer) provided a report on the preliminary financial results of Christ Church for 2009 which reflected total revenues from pledges, loose offerings, music income and rent and income from our facilities of \$1,336,000 as compared to our total expenses of \$1,536,000. The \$200,000 operating deficit for the year was funded by a combination of one-time gifts (Rhoda Brown's gift of \$100,000) and as previously approved by the Vestry, utilizing up to 5% of the Memorial and Gifts Fund to help balance our 2009 budget. Kathy also presented the proposed budget for Christ Church for 2010. Highlights of the proposed budget include projected revenues of \$1,490,000 and total expenses of \$1,529,000 which results in a modest projected deficit for the year of \$39,000. The 2010 budget includes a \$165,000 pledge to the Chicago Diocese, as compared to the \$160,000 pledge made to the Diocese by Christ Church last year. After discussion, the Vestry voted to accept the 2010 budget that was presented by the Treasurer. In addition, the Vestry approved engaging the accounting firm of Selden Fox as the auditors for Christ Church for 2010.

David Russell (Investments) updated the Vestry on the recent performance of our various investment funds which have benefitted by the continued improvement in the value of the funds that we have allocated to equities. He reported that the Investment Committee had met in November to review the current investment allocations and had recommended some modest adjustments in our target levels.

Robin Anstaett (Outreach/Shrove Tuesday Program) reported that Christ Church Rummage has offered to send a donation of clothing to the Haitian Relief Effort through the Haitian employees at Grand Foods. She also outlined plans for our Shrove Tuesday program on February 16th which will feature a Pancake Supper prepared and served by the outgoing and current members of the Vestry.

The Rector also announced that the Vestry will be holding a retreat on the evening of Friday, January 29th and on the morning of Saturday, January 30th. The program will provide all of the Vestry members an opportunity to get to know each other better and for each to gain familiarity with all of the Program and Administrative areas of Christ Church that are led by Vestry members. The Rector announced that the Nominating Committee had identified Marcy Champagne, Lawson Whitesides, Julie Flood, Robin Anstaett and Kurt Anstaett who have been asked and have agreed to serve on the Vestry subject to the approval of the Parish at the Annual Meeting on January 24th. In addition, Mary Downie has agreed to serve as the Clerk of Christ Church, subject to an affirmative vote of the Vestry at its February 23rd meeting.

The Rector thanked the retiring members and officers of the Vestry, Lindsay Gorman, Robin Anstaett, Steve Hudson, David Russell, Buffy Ervin, and Kurt Anstaett, for their years of service to Christ Church.

The meeting concluded with prayer and compline at 9:15 pm.
