“Living in Community”

“They continued steadfastly in the apostles’ teaching and fellowship in the breaking of bread and prayers.” (Acts 2:42)

Such is the experience of the early church: a community formed in the light of the resurrection and based in its relationship with Jesus Christ. Today, we 21st century Christians continue in that tradition as we gather for worship and fellowship, to grow in our relationship with Christ and one another.

Following a yearlong focus on “Journeys of Faith,” the Continuing Adult Education Committee is pleased to announce a new series of Parish Forums centering on the subject of “living in community.” At baptism, we are initiated into the Church, the Christian community, and as members of that body, we become “Christians.” We are launched on our life-long journey of faith. We are nurtured spiritually in the community of faith, the Church, but we are called to incarnate our faith within the several communities of which we are part—our families, neighborhoods, schools, workplaces and others. How do we as Christians embody our faith in the larger communities to which we belong? How does our Sunday morning worship inform the ways we *are* in those various communities? What distinguishes us as Christians, and what is our unique contribution in the community?

Please join us on Sunday mornings from 10:10-11a.m. for the Parish Forum as we explore this topic from a variety of angles. Together, we will *be* a community of faith and, with the help of outside speakers as well as our own clergy and fellow parishioners, come to understand more fully the importance of community in our formation and development as Christians.

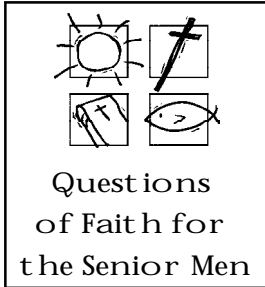

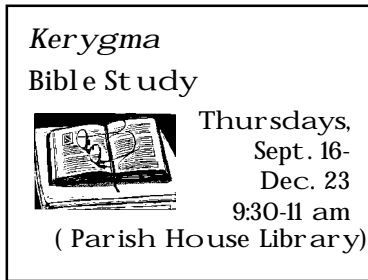

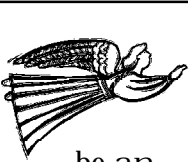

A RUMMAGE PRIMER:

Donating...

Gently used items, please!

Hours: *Weekdays* from 8:00 am to 4 pm; *Weekends* 8 am – noon

Call Rummage Coordinator Mary-Anne Badenhorst (847-446-2850, ext. 35) for furniture pickup.

Note: Tax receipts given.

Sorting (all year long!)...

Hours: Monday and Thursday mornings. Once you learn the ropes, sorting can be done at your convenience!

Sorters toss all “grubby” or stained clothing. We do not keep anything that needs repairs. We also toss non-working appliances, china and kitchen items that are dirty, mattresses, etc. Our standards are high! (If it wouldn’t sell at a garage sale, we can’t sell it here.)

Call Mary-Anne at the Parish office.

Note: Sorters are allowed to buy throughout the year.

Working at Fall Rummage (Thursday, October 7)...

You can pick your favorite of 45 departments!

Hours: Variable! Your time commitment depends on which department you work in, but most of our departments set up on Flyover Day (**Saturday, September 25**), and workers sort and price up until Pre-Sale Day (**Wednesday, October 6**). It is possible to work evenings or weekends with prior arrangement. Workers must log in at least 10 hours with their chairman in order to shop at Pre-Sale.

Sale Day Hours: 7 am - 4 pm. Sign up with your chairman for your shift. It is possible to work sale day just a few hours—many hands are especially needed during the early morning rush.

Call Mary-Anne at the Parish Office or any member of the Steering Committee or your Department Chair.

Note: Rummage is our largest outreach endeavor and opportunity for camaraderie. Be a part of it!

Chairing a Department...

Hours: Vary by department, but most chairmen expect to work the whole day on PreSale and Sale Days.

Chairmen recruit their own workers (many come back year after year), oversee sorting, pricing, display and sale of merchandise. Most departments complete their work on weekdays up until Pre-Sale Day. It is possible to work evenings or weekends if you prefer. Chairmen whose departments are open for Summer Rummage also plan for that event.

Note: All chairmen have Pre-Sale privileges.

Fly(ing) Over...

Hours: 8 am – 3 pm, Saturday, September 25; 11 am to ? on Sunday, September 26

Flyover refers to moving boxes from storage in the West Building to the departments set up in Tents, Parish House and Woman’s Club. Many hands make light work!
